Carnivore - an animal that only eats other animals.

Census - an exact count of every animal in an area.

Crepuscular - an animal active during dawn and dusk.

Diurnal - active during the day.

Habitat - the area that provides a living thing with adequate food, water, shelter, space.

Herbivore - an animal that only eats plant material.

Home Range - the space that an animal occupies during its life.

Nocturnal - active during the night.

Omnivore - an animal that eats plant material and other animals.

Population - the number of individuals of a particular species in an area.

Population Index - a method of telling how abundant animals are by counting signs the animals leave instead of counting the animals themselves.

Predator - an animal that eats other animals.

Prey - an animal that is eaten by other animals.

Sample - an estimate made by studying part of the entire population.

Taxonomy - the science of identification, naming and classification of living organisms.

Warm-blooded - an animal with the ability to generate and conserve heat in order to maintain a stable, warm body temperature.

Vertebrate - an animal with a backbone or spine.
